

MinNature Making “Micro-Movement” One Step At A Time - 27 July 2017

MinNature Masterbuilders started the second phase of works since beginning of June 2017. The works involve a lot on automating and mechanizing the miniature models.

Planning for the works started in late February 2017 and after hundreds of hours brainstorming on ways to make things move, the Masterbuilders, led by Jerome Ong, started fabricating and inserting the automations and mechanized miniatures by stages. After 2 months of continuous works, there are over 20 push buttons which activates movements around MinNature; from wind turbines to excavators and even to dancing Mah Meri tribes.

“Animating such small objects, at 1/87 scale, is definitely a great challenge, however, the team employ their most innovative and creative ideas to overcome any problems encountered,” said Wan Cheng Huat, founder of MinNature.

Ultimately, the team intends to fabricate and insert at least another 50 push button movements over the next three months.

On top of the moving miniature trains, MinNature added moving vehicles all around the Dataran centrepiece. These newest additions, specially ordered from Faller GmbH, Germany, will bring more life to the model exhibitions.
